

GEORGE D. O'DAY TROPHY

In 1962, George D. O'Day presented to the North American Yacht Racing Union (United States Yacht Racing Union and now known as the United States Sailing Association) a trophy bearing his name. This trophy is to be sailed for in singlehanded boats and the winner is to be known as the United States Singlehanded Champion. Competition is open to representatives of Yacht Racing Associations belonging to U.S. Sailing Association and also to the yachtsmen and women representing the Inter-Collegiate Yacht Racing Association, U.S. Youth and U.S. Women's champions. The trophy was first sailed for and awarded in 1962 in Finns on Long Island Sound. The O'Day Trophy has been raced for and awarded every year thereafter.

To maintain the integrity of the trophy, it will remain on display at the National Governing Body of the sport - U.S. Sailing Association
