Remember your Techniques				
Coming alongside	slow to 1-2 kts, slighlty off head ot wind, let the sailboat come alongside, aft quarter to leeward to give space to escape if needed. If coming alongside a disabled sailboat, do so as not to drift onto it, generally better approach from leeward but watch for lines in prop			
Towing	have sailboat come to you, hand-off tow line, ask to fasten to mast and lower sails whenever possible, tow line 30ft + in waves, max 4kts			
Assisting Capsized	watch for crew & prop, approach bow to bow, grab tow line to steady head to wind in reverse/idle			
Man overboard	approach from downwind at idle speed to try catching on quarter bow, leeward side, turn engine off when recovering			
*** when assisting, always notify that accepting assistance means dropping from racing				
Most Important:  In man overboard or capsizing situation first priority is a head-count and looking out for recognition signal from competitor  Cut-off engine when at contact with crew in the water				
The Leading Safety may direct you to a RYC drop-off point or to a Safe Area East of				

the Jetty
