All US Sailing Staff and Interns

Group 2 (Mandatory SafeSport training and Background Check)

US Sailing Championships; Olympic Development Program and US Sailing Team:

o Staff coaches; Contract coaches; US Sailing Coach applicants

o Support personnel to include but not be limited to medical; therapeutic; boat wrights

Group 3: Other individuals agreed by the Safe Sport Entity and an NGB to be within the Safe Sport Entity's jurisdiction

Educational personnel to include:

Master Instructor Trainers; Instructor Trainers (Mandatory SafeSport training and Background Check) All Instructor Candidates onboarding in 2018 (Mandatory SafeSport training)

All Instructors that are recertifying in 2018 must take training at time of renewal (Mandatory SafeSport training)

All certified instructors not due for renewal in 2018 must complete SafeSport training by December 31, 2018 (Mandatory SafeSport training)

US Sailing Certified Race Officials for US Sailing Championships and other events for which US Sailing is the Organizing Authority such as: PROs; umpires, judges and measurers (Mandatory SafeSport training)

US Sailing Race Official candidates applying in 2018, and all race Officials who are renewing certifications in 2018 must complete training at time of renewal (Mandatory SafeSport training)

Any certified US Sailing Race Official not due for renewal in 2018 must complete SafeSport training before December 31, 2018 (Mandatory SafeSport training)

Committee Chairs that are responsible for US Sailing Championships (Mandatory SafeSport training) Other Championship Committee members (Strongly recommend SafeSport training)

Members (Encouraged to take SafeSport training)

For the avoidance of doubt, these policies do not directly apply to US Sailing's organizational members; however, US Sailing strongly encourages its organizational members to adopt similar SafeSport programs and policies.
