Minutes Meeting - March 1st 2012

Agenda Items in black with Notes in blue

- > Survey Results do they reveal 'a Need' for the Hobie Championship Series?
 - Mike Levesque looking at it for future events (2013 and beyond). There is definite interest in the event. A team
 has been formed to review the survey data. There is a need to move forward on the sailors' responses. Some of
 the survey results can help the 2012 event process (sailors are open to change, and willing to pay for charter
 boats).
- Establish Sub Committees for qualifying/selection, yearly equipment selection, site and schedule selection, and for ratings/measurement (ISAF)
 - Discussion tabled until it can be determined if there is going to be a 2012 Multihull Championship Event.
 - Discussion that this needs to be in place for future events.
- > 2012 Regatta host bid "To be or not to be?"
 - There is a current bid on the table for an open, BYOB event, to be run under Portsmouth handicap. No action was taken on the current bid.
 - Many questions were raised regarding the event. Discussion points noted below and no decisions made at this time, strictly asking question, sharing perspective, making comments and points of discussion. More information is needed; actions have been assigned and will be reported on in the follow-on meeting of March 8th.
 - Is this event a one design BYOB?



- Is this a multiple One-Design event BYOB? If so, what classes are being proposed? (F16, F18, A-Cat?)
- Is this event open to anyone who wants to come, or will qualification be required?
- Since in 2011, the conditions for the Area Qualifiers identified the US Sailing Multihull Championship would provide the boats for the event. Changing this to a BYOB event would contradict the specified conditions.
- The conditions currently state that Area Qualifiers and a number of other "invitation" slots (past champion, national champions from multihull classes, manufacturer reps) are qualified. The only positions currently identified (to an individual) are the Area Qualifiers (and potentially, the past champion).
- The conditions were written in 2009 and apply to the 2012 event unless changed with or prior to publication of the NOR.
- Half of Championships are a combination of BYOB and charter, the other half are host-supplied boats.
- Teams that were pre-qualified in their Area Qualifiers should be provided a boat (or a reduced charter fee).
 Conversely, for the areas which did not hold a qualifier, the teams would have to provide their own boats (or pay a full charter fee).
- All teams should pay a charter fee. Since no fee or range of fees was known, and/or boat availability was unknown, an action item #2 was assigned. Team to make recommendation and present their findings at a follow on meeting to be held on March 8th. The survey indicates that sailors are willing to spend \$400-500 on charter fees. The most recent data is that for the past few years, the boats were provided at a cost of \$700 each; early indication from manufacturers is that this is likely to reach \$1000 in 2012.



- Committee members and guests were asked to submit their questions in writing and PBYC will prepare answers for the next meeting.
- Schedule a follow-on telecon for March 8th 5:00 pm PST, 7:00pm CST, 8:00pm EST.
- A follow-on telecon will be penciled in for March 13th 5:00 pm PST, 7:00pm CST, 8:00pm EST.
- This telecon will only transpire if additional event proposal questions need to be responded to.
- Regatta proposal must be reviewed and approved on or before 3/15. E-mail vote may be taken in lieu of this
 meeting if the proposal is in a state with minor clarifications or corrections.
- Bid must be voted on or before March 15th.
- Brian Welsh must be contacted regarding any Sponsorship plans before any sign-off of sponsorship.
- The Viper F16 is being used for the equipment trials in Spain on 3/25. It appears to be the boat of choice and
 probably the training platform for a couple of years even if not selected as the equipment for the 2016 Games. This
 is being looked at to tie this into the Olympic Championships.
- There are 2 potential processes for acquiring boats. The first is that the USMHC Committee contacts the boat
 manufacturers and makes arrangements to provide the boats. The second choice, and what seemed to be the
 preferred method, was the sailors would be given the names of the manufacturers whereby they contact the
 manufacturer and deal directly with them. Nigel and John Casey will be making a recommendation at the next
 Multihull Championship Committee meeting.



- > Identify sailors pre-qualified for 2012 and list upcoming Alter semi finals by Area.
- Jake Kohl, Jamie Livingston, and Johnny Lovell will review the current conditions for eligibility and recommend amendments for 2012 and recommend changes for future years during this quad.
- Class Association membership to US Sailing
 - Various boat classes have not submitted their requests to include their boat as a US Sailing recognized class.
 Classes who are members can be identified through the Member Search feature of the US Sailing website. No action taken.
- Name Change to US Sailing National Catamaran Championship (I/O to meet by laws).
 - The title would be the United States Catamaran Championship.
 - Discussion tabled.
- Fiscal Responsibility review the budget/accounting records for the Hoyt Jolley Fund for the past three years.
 - Liz reported that \$2000 may be used every year (per the Hoyt Jolley Fund's original charter). Current balance is \$53,000. For the last few years \$7000 per year has been handed out. At the current spend rate, the fund will be depleted in 7 years. While the original charter allows additional funds to be withdrawn with US Sailing Board approval, the intent was to only spend the interest on the Hoyt Jolley Fund. The Board has indicated that they are hesitant to approve additional withdrawals going forward; without a documented plan of how to rebuild the fund.
 - Bert indicated there were sponsors willing to donate to sailing events, such as BP, Subway, Rolex. Bert will
 coordinate his sponsorship efforts with Brian Welsh in the Marketing Department.
