
# Sailing/Rotation Areas:

Racing will take place on the southwest side of Bristol Harbor, immediately outside the mooring field, and in close proximity to the Bristol Maritime Center. The Maritime Center has an indoor space, bathrooms, race course viewing, and docks for rotations. Water will be provided at Bristol YC and at the Maritime Center; please bring your reusable water bottles.

Race boats will be available for 45 minute practice windows on Thursday starting at 1300. All team members must be present to practice and teams will be assigned boats on a first come first serve basis when registering.

All sailors are asked to come to the Club each morning and move to the Maritime Center by boat. We will have gear transportation for those sailing race boats, and launch and rib rides for sailors not in the first set of races. If you decide to drive to the other side of the harbor there is parking but you could be in a boat sailing back to the Club at the end of the day.

Near the rotation area is the Prudence Island Ferry (pictured below). When the ferry is arriving and departing the area we will need to keep clear and may need to suspend racing. The ferry times are 0945 departure, 1100 arrival, and 1530 departure.

# **Rotation and Racing Format:**

Scheduling and being in the right place are very important for this event. Having cooperation between race management and competitors is essential to provide the quality and quantity of competition.

We will be using a Swiss League format with 10 fleets of boats on one race course with very limited time between races. Stage 1 of the competition will be a computerized Swiss League. The program takes the order of the teams at the end of each round and matches the team in first with the team in second and so on down the list. The program will not to match teams more than once in any five-round period. A round is a set of 12 races, where all teams race once. After finishing, teams need to proceed quickly to the rotation area to allow the next teams to arrive for their start on time. If there is a no-show team, the opposing team will be given a walk-over after all of its boats have started and sailed to mark two on the course. It is imperative that you be in the boats and on the race course for your start; the Race Committee will not wait.

We will have 30 420s for this event to maximize racing. Fleets of boats will always compete against each other, so red will always sail blue. We have 18 E 420s from Zim, six LP Z420s from Roger Williams University, and six LP Collegiate 420s from Bristol YC. The fleets starting will be identified using flags flown from the stern of the Signal Boat.

During the first stage, the computer will be scheduling races as far in advance as possible, but sometimes it's not very far. At the end of every round, the schedule for the next round is worked out by the program and displayed. To help you know where we are in the schedule, the rotation will be displayed on screens in the rotation area and available online. Competitors can keep up with rotation and scores on their phones by viewing the file/webpage.

Rotation and Score Link will be provided at the competitors' meeting.

### Meals and Event Schedule:

Saturday evening will include a dinner under a tent on the Bristol Yacht Club lawn with some music. Tickets for sailors are included in your registration package and extra tickets can be purchased for guests here-

### **Bristol YC House Rules**

These rules are for the guidance of members and guests. Above all, common sense and courtesy will ensure everyone s enjoyment of the Club. The Flag Officers and Executive Committee are always available for any necessary clarification or advice.

- 1. No one under the legal drinking age will be permitted in the Chart Room at any time that the Club bar is open.
- 2. Consumption of alcoholic beverages must be confined to those sold by the Club over the bar or, for special events, by the bottle or the case. Liquor purchased at the Club must be consumed on the Club premises. This rule does not apply to the consumption of alcoholic beverages from a yacht's locker while the yacht is at the Club dock, provided that the consumption remains within the vicinity of the yacht. (Required to maintain the Club's liquor license.)
- 3. Obviously intoxicated persons will not be served alcohol at the Club.
- 4. Shoes and shirts must be worn in the Clubhouse at all times.
- 5. Wet clothing may not be worn in the Clubhouse.
- 6. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their children. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or designated responsible adult while on Club property.
- 7. Smoking in the Clubhouse is not permitted.
