II. Announcements - President's Report

President Rich Jepsen thanked everyone for attending this evening's call and taking the time to review the association report. He shared updates regarding joining World Sailing and the IOC in taking a stand against the war in Ukraine. He noted US Sailing has moved to suspend the participation of Russian and Belarusian athletes, teams and Race Officials at US Sailing events. He also shared that the Foundation and Membership team are looking to refresh the President's club and additional news will be coming over the next few months. Lastly, he asked everyone on the call to think about diversity in everything we do. He shared our organization and sport need to reflect the demographics of our country and that he would like us to embark on a process to get there.

Ⅳ. Staff Reports

a. **CEO Report**

The Association report stands as submitted. The full report can be found, HERE.

Alan Ostfield, CEO, reminded the Board the huddle notes are posted on Boardable weekly. Additionally, he shared Heather is starting to engage with key departments on monthly budget reviews. This process is a great way for everyone to become smarter about their business and connect on the importance of the budget. Lastly, he shared a couple of HR updates including hiring an offshore coordinator to support Jim in the Offshore Dept and that they are close to hiring a membership director.

b. CFO Report

Heather Monoson, CFO, provided a snapshot of the revenue and expense numbers for February and year-to-date. She shared that from a top-line perspective we are doing better than planned. She noted on a few variances, one being the investment income which is not surprising given the current geopolitical climate and the other being salary and benefits which we expect will increase as positions fill.

c. SVP Programs & Services

Andrew Clouston, SVP Program & Services, gave a summary of communications that went out regarding updates to the insurance policy. He shared we are working to create guidance for RO on questions and considerations they should ask Clubs to understand coverage. He gave an overview of the different materials available for our different entities that explain the changes. Lastly, he stated he is happy for the opportunity to engage with anyone or group who has questions.

Charlie Arms, Secretary, shared the 1-page overview of the logistics for the in-person Board meeting in Bristol, on May 11 & 12.

∨I. Treasurer's Report

John Schoendorf, Treasurer, shared Maggie Shea and Sally Barkow are close to completing the athlete handbook. He is impressed with the progress made so far.

VII. Gender ID Task Force Update

Patrick Burks shared that the Taskforce is comprised of the following volunteers: Erin Riley, Cory Sertl, Maggie Shea, Sarah Lihan, Ariel Shumar, Oakclin Keefe, and Stephanie Helms along with staff members Blair Overman, Justin Sterk, and Renee Wetterland. He provided a summary of what the taskforces process has been so far and major points they have agreed upon as well as a glossary of terms for those unfamiliar with the transgender community or topics. They have conducted broad background research on the topic of the inclusion of transgender athletes in sports from both sociological and physiological perspectives. He shared the Taskforce is proceeding forward with a policy based on self-identification of an athlete's gender for competition. He stated they are striving to create a policy and process that is simple, objective, easy to manage, and fair to all athletes. Rich shared the goal is for the final policy to be voted on during the July meeting.

VIII. Committee Restructure Task Force Update

Andrew Clouston shared they are in the formation stage of the Taskforce which will consist of current committee members, board, and staff. He noted this will not be a quick process and the first task will be a discovery process to understand the current structure and the relationship and role of the committee and staff liaison.

Henry Brauer shared the committee received a comprehensive analysis from Heather and Renee outlining merit increases that are appropriate and match the approved budget.

b. Nominating Committee Report

Charlie Arms shared the committee met to review the work plan for the year. She shared they are looking at tools to analyze the strengths and gaps to ensure we have a well-rounded board. Additionally, this year she shared we will be nominating an independent director. This seat will be someone who is not a US Sailing member and not necessarily involved in sailing. They are considering different options on how to find these nominations.

US Sailing Bylaws Update 2022-01-XX OffshoreRegulations 4.01 an

Add a new section to Regulation 1.02 DEFINITIONS, ABBREVIATIONS, ACRONYMS as follows: PHRF Performance Handicap Racing Formula.

Amend Regulations 4.01 as follows:

4.01 US Sailing Bylaws 501 authorizes seven Operating Divisions for the purpose of coordinating the activities of committees grouped within these Divisions.

Delete the current Regulation 4.05 and REPLACE it with the following:

4.05 OFFSHORE AND TECHNOLOGY DIVISION

The Offshore and Technology Division is responsible for promoting and coordinating the products and services that help members enjoy their one-design and offshore-capable boats. The responsibilities include supporting measurement for offshore and one-design boats; supporting the rating rules and handicapping systems used in the United States; supporting the organizing authorities that manage specific races and regattas; overseeing regulations, rules, educational initiatives, and technology supporting racing; and addressing safety concerns of all size boats.

Offshore and Technology Division Committees and their responsibilities:

- 1. Handicapping: report on trends and issues from around the country and recommend improvements to the management of rating rules serviced by US Sailing while consulting with affiliated rules organizations, local fleets, event organizers, and boat owners, including measurement-based handicapping and empirical handicapping such as PHRF and Portsmouth Number; Seek out and recommend improvements to boat measurement under the UMS (Universal Measurement System), rule development, technical data improvement to information systems, and best practices for fair rule implementation; work with national and international partners towards common measurement procedures and nomenclature, and to ensure that user interfaces and functionality needs are met. Subcommittees shall include:
 - a. Measurement rules;
 - b. Portsmouth Number; and
 - c. (c) PHRF.
- 2. Technology: Support and advise US Sailing staff on key aspects of the use of technology within US Sailing.
- 3. Safety at Sea: Coordinate safety research and safety education programs for nearshore, coastal, and offshore sailors; report on sailing incidents and determine lessons learned; acknowledge acts of heroism by awarding the Arthur B. Hanson Rescue Medal as appropriate; recommend changes to the U.S. Safety Equipment Requirements; and provide a US perspective to World Sailing regarding training and equipment requirements.
- 4. Offshore Racing Development: Seek out opportunities to expand and support offshore sailing; enhance the products and services of the Offshore and Technology Division; and recommend plans for market penetration and membership growth to US Sailing Staff.
- 5. Measurers and Equipment Inspectors: Develop and support measurers and equipment inspectors within the US for all boats and sails; develop and maintain training and testing for event equipment inspection; assist sailing organizations in obtaining measurers or equipment inspectors for events; provide support and advice on the roles and conduct of measurers and equipment inspectors at US Sailing events; and submit candidates for approval by the Board as nominees for World Sailing International Measurers.

BAR 20220315 Changes to the US Sailing Regulations

1.02 DEFINITIONS, ABBREVIATIONS, AND ACRONYMS

The following definitions, abbreviations, and acronyms apply in these regulations:

Sailor Athlete An A-Level, B-Level, or C-Level A 10-Year, 10-Year+, or Actively Engaged Sailor Athlete as defined in Bylaw 105 – Definitions.

12.03 PROTECTED COMPETITIONS

..

- B **Procedures for Protected Competitions**. US Sailing shall ensure that the Organizing Authority includes the following rules and procedures in the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions for a Protected Competition:
 - The US Sailing Prescriptions to rules 60.3, 63.1, and 63.2 shall apply to a Protected Competition, except that the words "when practicable" in (a) and (b) in the prescription to rule 63.1 are deleted.
 - Protest committees shall include 20% "sailor-athlete" 10-Year or 10-Year+ Sailor Athlete representation. "Sailor-athlete" has the meaning of "athlete" set forth in USOPC Bylaw, Section 8.8.2 (the 10-year rule) or Level A or B Sailor-Athlete as defined by US Sailing Sailor Athlete Council (SAC) Bylaws 3.3.1 and 3.3.2 (except that the US Sailing member class referred to in SAC Bylaw 3.3.2.3 shall be an international class recognized by World Sailing at the time of the sailor-athlete's qualification).

15.04 HEARING PROCEDURE AND DECISION

A. <u>Hearing Panel Composition</u>. When the Review Board Chair decides to conduct a hearing, he or she shall appoint a Hearing Panel of three Review Board members, at least one of whom shall be an A-Level or B-Level Sailor Athlete a 10-Year or 10-Year+Sailor Athlete. The Review Board Chair shall appoint one hearing panel member to serve as Chair of the hearing panel. The Hearing Panel must be constituted of disinterested individuals.

15.05 APPEALS

. . .

D. <u>Appeals Panel Composition</u>. For appeals filed in accordance with Regulation 15.05.A the Review Board Chair shall appoint an Appeals Panel of at least three Review Board members, at least 1/3 of whom shall be <u>A-Level or B-Level 10-Year or 10-Year+</u> Sailor Athletes. A member taking part in the appeal must not have been a member of the Hearing Panel.
