# SIEBEL SAILORS PROGRAM



### Felix Finds His Confidence, thanks to you!

At the start of his first sailing lesson, Felix was afraid to even put his foot in the water for a water comfort check. The turtle grass that floated under the dock filled him with dread.

Felix's fears could have ended his sailing days before they even started. **But in US Sailing's Siebel Sailors Program, Felix felt supported and valued.** 

He went from being terrified of the water ... to timidly getting into the sailboat ... to eagerly awaiting the next lesson.

Each of these steps may seem small, but every one of them was huge for Felix.

- You helped 787 youth become more confident, overcome challenges, and learn to sail.
- You expanded access at 19 sailing centers in 7 states and Washington, D.C.
- You supported a diverse cadre of young sailors. 47% identified as female or non-binary and 54% identified as non-white.
- You helped provide scholarship assistance for almost three quarters of students, reaching a new generation who would not otherwise have a chance to sail.

### You strengthened the path to the podium for future Olympic sailors!





You supported sailors like world kiteboarding champion Daniela Moroz. She claimed victory at the 2021 Formula Kite European Championships in Montpelier, France and secured her fifth Women's Formula Kite World Championship title in Torregrande, Italy.

You also helped to launch a robust training platform for the future American Olympians in 2021 that includes coaching, equipment, nutrition, mental health, and teamwork.

"Training with the squad has been amazing," said Daniela. "It makes such a big difference when you have people pushing you. Our kite squad brings a neat range of perspectives to the table whether it's sailing, technology, engineering, kiting - whatever it may be, everyone has something to add to the group so we're all improving together."

- Build a pipeline of talented youth sailors in high-performance classes
- Institute the first all-team training camp
- Host Olympic-class competition in US waters through the West Marine US Open Sailing Series
- Support athletes in the Youth Sailing World Championship and Youth Olympic Games
- Propel American sailors forward on their path to the podium!
- Create Project Pinnacle, a holistic and strategic training program for the US Sailing Team. And the results of your support are already clear. American sailors had eight Top-10 finishes at the European and World regattas in 2021 and the US Youth Worlds Team was one of the Top 3 overall nations at the Youth Worlds competition.

# ADAPTIVE SAILING

This year was our first year integrating our sailing school and adaptive sailing programs. Although we have had the privilege of National Sports Center for the Disabled (NSCD) coming in on Fridays, we had never thought about ways to include our differently-abled members in our weekly sailing school.

But then a US Sailing instructor, Coach Chris, came to our little lake and helped us find ways to improve our program. He taught us how important it is to be more inclusive and showed us how to better connect, speak to, and teach differently-abled sailors.



We came away better prepared for the summer and with so many new goals in mind. Our main goal was to invite Hannah and Jamie, who had been part of NSCD for years, to join our sailing school.





Hannah has a cognitive disability and Jamie has a rare connective tissue disorder. These girls are both huge parts of our yacht club and always make everyone in their paths smile.

After testing the waters with them to see what worked and what didn't, both girls were able to sail with our program! We developed new ways to teach that fit their individual needs. They had a great time and so did we – both on and off the water!

I could not be more grateful to Coach Chris and to Jamie and Hannah for helping us figure out how to integrate sailing school with adaptive sailing. It has been a real game changer!

### Safety

Helping you stay safe on the water is a key aspect of US Sailing's mission. Online and in-person courses prepare sailors of every age to be ready in case of emergencies, act quickly if they happen, and take steps to prevent them in the first place.

In 2021, we issued more than 3,600 Safety at Sea certificates to sailors who completed courses, while hundreds more became certified sailing instructors and coaches.

### Cruising

Cruising lets you enjoy a local cove, an overnight trip to a nearby island, or even a coastal passage. Whether you travel across the bay or across oceans, cruising is part of the sailing lifestyle. And it can be enjoyed from coast to coast, at every stage of life!

In 2021, more than 200 centers around the country signed up to offer US Sailing's First Sail curriculum, helping thousands of new sailors get on the water. And sailors accessed US Sailing's Where to Sail webpage more than 39,000 times!




### **USSA** and **USSF** Relationship and Collaboration
