From launching the new Youth Performance Pathway, which was created through the year-long work of experts from inside and outside US Sailing; to building out our training facility in Marseille with key logistics support from dedicated supporters; to strengthening educational programs and materials with the input of countless members and coaches, you have helped to move US Sailing forward.

2022 was also marked by the establishment of the James M. "Ding" Schoonmaker II Project Pinnacle Endowment Fund. This significant investment in the US Sailing Team and Olympic Development Program, along with the matching funds it will inspire, demonstrates confidence in America's athletes and in US Sailing's ability to bring them back to the top of the podium.

It is an honor to work together with you, our members and donors, to promote and strengthen the sport we love, and to steward your gifts wisely and transparently. Together, we are headed on a positive course.

Thanks to your support, significant strides were made for both the US Sailing Team and Olympic Development Program (ODP). You helped to:

- Increase participation at the US Open sailing series, doubling the number of sailors who competed over the previous year. The US Open series are now a critical part of the domestic racing and training pathway for Olympic hopefuls.
- Establish a training center in Marseilles, enabling US sailors to become familiar with, practice, and compete on the future Olympic waters.
- Create opportunities for up-and-coming talent to train at youth camps in Long Beach and San Diego, foiling camps in Hawaii and the Columbia River Gorge, and an FX camp in Miami.
- Provide holistic support to athletes, including best-in-class coaching and equipment, as well as nutrition, meteorology, and physical and mental fitness.
- Establish endowment Funds (the Schoonmaker Endowment and the Burnham Fund) that will grow into a steady source of support for the Team and ODP sailors.

Bookended by all-Team training camps in January and December, 2022 was marked by strong athlete progress across all classes.

 Daniela Moroz won her 6th consecutive World Championship in the Women's Formula Kite.

• In the 49er class, Ian Barrows and Hans Henken finished 2nd at the Princess Sofia regatta and were joined in the top-five by fellow USST sailors Andrew Mollerus and Ian MacDiarmid.

• Steph Roble and Maggie Shea finished 5th at the 49er FX World Championships in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

• Sarah Newberry Moore and David Liebenberg had their best performance ever at a World Championship in the Nacra 17, finishing 16th overall.

YOUTH COMPETITION

Your support helped young sailors navigate their next steps in sailing, keeping them engaged and excited about the sport. In 2022, you helped:

- 314 of America's top sailors compete in the US Sailing Championships, including the US Junior Women's Championship, the Chubb US Junior Championship, the US Youth Match Racing Championship, and the US Youth Championship.
- Host USA Junior Olympic Sailing Festivals at 10 JO Regattas from Hawaii to Massachusetts, Minnesota to Texas, bringing together youth racers for fun, quality racing, and access to the Youth Pathways.
- Pilot the JO Try-it-out Clinic in Pensacola, FL, with sailors demoing performance sailing on wingfoils, windsurfers, skiffs, and keelboats and learning from industry experts.
- Launch the updated <u>Youth Racing Central webpage</u>, with master event calendars, boat class information, and pathway resources for youth sailors, parents, coaches, and clubs.
- Release the new <u>Youth Performance Pathway</u>, outlining the transitions from youth racer to lifelong sailor and Olympian.





RACE ADMINISTRATION

US Sailing Race Officials ensure fairness and quality of competition, so sailors can be assured of consistency and high standards wherever they race. In 2022, you helped to fund:

- The complete overhaul of US Sailing's Advanced Race Management seminars.
- A 31% increase in the number of Race Management seminars offered.
- A return to in-person seminars, augmented by ongoing online seminars for increased reach and access.
- More Judge Protest Days, Roundtables, and Clinics than in the previous two years.

SAFETY AT SEA

Improving safety has long been a top priority at US Sailing. In 2022, your funding supported key developments in our Learn to Sail curriculum, enhancing online deployment of the course to meet the increased demand. We continue to integrate key lessons from incidents in offshore racing and bluewater cruising into the coursework, ensuring that sailors are safe and can employ best practices into their daily routines on the water.

In 2022, a record number of US Sailing members took Safety at Sea courses. More than 3,000 sailors completed online and in-person classes, preparing them to be ready in case of emergencies, act quickly when they happen, and take steps to prevent them in the first place. You are making the waters safer for everyone.



2022 Revenue


