INTRODUCTION

Team USA will be represented at Paris 2024 by 13 sailors hailing from eight U.S. states and territories including California, Florida, Illinois, Minnesota, New York, Rhode Island, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Wisconsin. The sailing events of the XXXIII Olympiad will take place from July 26 to August 11, 2024 with sailing races happening between July 28th and August 9th. The racing venue is the historic bay of Marseille on the Mediterranean, approximately 500 miles southeast of Paris, considered a "satellite venue."

The largest sporting event in the world, the Olympic Games will feature approximately 10,500 athletes from over 200 countries competing in 329 medal events. The sailing events will feature approximately 330 athletes competing in ten classes, with USA participation in nine.

Team USA is bringing fresh talent to the waters of Marseille with nine of the thirteen athletes making their first Olympic appearance. Roble, Shea, and Dallman-Weiss will return for their second Games following Tokyo. Stu McNay will sail his fifth Olympics in the 470 but first in the mixed discipline after it made the shift from an all men's boat following Toyko 2020. The U.S. will not compete in the Men's Singlehanded Dinghy (ILCA 7) event after narrowly missing national qualification in that class.

The program is led by Marcus Lynch, who has been involved in the professional sailing scene since 2000 — first as an athlete for the British Sailing Team (BST), then as a coach for the BST's Paralympic Team in London 2012 & Rio 2016. Most recently, Lynch served as Olympic Performance Manager for the German Sailing Team for Tokyo 2020, their most successful Games in over two decades.

Sally Barkow and Kate Drummey are serving as Deputy Team Leaders for Paris 2024. Barkow is a 2008 Olympian and has been professionally involved with the US Team since 2019 - first as an Athlete Advisory Council rep and US Sailing Board Member, then as a Nacra 17 coach and Performance Manager, and now as the Team's Head of Olympic Operations. Drummey has spent her entire career working in Olympic sport, first entering the scene out of college with the US Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC). She joined the US Sailing Team in 2015 and serves as the team's Olympic Operations Manager. This will be her third Olympics with the Sailing Team.

American sailors have been a part of every Olympic Games since Paris 1900. Team USA has won 60 medals in sailing, second-most only to Great Britain as of Tokyo 2020, and some of the most accomplished sailors in history have competed at the Games under the stars and stripes.

OLYMPIC SAILING OVERVIEW

DATES

Sailing at the Paris 2024 Olympics will take place from July 28 through August 8 with August 9th serving as a reserve day in case of bad weather.

WHAT'S SPECIAL ABOUT SAILING AT PARIS 2024

- Kiteboarding will make it's debut at Paris 2024 and will be the fastest racing sport at the Games, reaching speeds of 72 kph / 45 mph.
- Though windsurfing made its Olympic debut at Los Angeles 1984, the discipline will debut the brand new foiling equipment – iQFOiL – at Paris 2024.
- The Nacra 17 is now fully foiling, after only being able to foil downwind for the Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020 Games. Now the fleet is able to foil both upwind and downwind.
- The 470 is now a mixed discipline, formerly two different boats of an all male team and an all female team. The "open" 470 made its Olympic debut in Montreal 1976 and was available to men and women, but was almost exclusively sailed by men. At Seoul 1988, the class was split into men's and women's boats, and Paris is set to welcome one mixed gender 470.

The move to the Mixed 470 contributed to sailing reaching the 50/50 equal medal opportunities for men and women at Paris 2024. Before, sailing was one of the few sports in the Olympics that welcomed men and women to the same playing field, and now sailing features both mixed disciplines and equal medal opportunities.




COURSES & SCORING

There are four race areas on the Bay of Marseille: "Corniche," "Marseille," "Frioul," and "Calangues," each named after cities or geographical features in and around Marseille. Separate races areas allow multiple fleets to compete on the water at the same time. Within each zone, the competitors will all race on the same "course" outlined by buoys. Each type of course has a name; the one below and to the right is called an "Inner Trapezoid."

The first boat/board around the buoys and through the finish line is the winner of that race, with multiple races constituting a regatta. The race winner receives one point for that race, second place receives two points, and so on. The boat/board with the fewest overall points at the end of the regatta wins the event.

Competitors work to make the top bracket by the last day of the regatta to advance to Finals. The last day of racing consists of a "Medal Race" for most of the classes, and a "Medal Series" for kiteboards and windsurfers. Finals Day

Competitors work to finish in the top bracket by the end of regular racing to qualify for Finals Day and a chance at a medal.



Reserve Day

Possible days race committee could use in case of bad weather on any of the scheduled Regular or Finals racing days.



TERMINOLOGY

OLYMPIAN

A Team USA sailing athlete does not become an Olympian until after their first race at an Olympic Games. For the time between earning selection to Paris and completing their first race in Marseille, they are considered a "nominated athlete."

SKIPPER & CREW

In double-handed classes, the skipper steers the boat and is the sailor in the back of the boat. The crew is in the front of the boat and handles any sails the skipper doesn't manage. It's safe to refer to the pair as "driver" and "crew" for accessibility when speaking to non-sailing audiences.

PARIS VS. MARSEILLE

Paris will host the 2024 Olympic Games but the sailing events will take place in Marseille in the south of France. We still say "Going to Paris" but we'll actually be sailing in Marseille.

REGATTA

The entire sailing competition as a whole. A regatta consists of many races over the course of the event.

FOILING

A type of sailing that uses a hydrofoil, which makes the boat or board look like it is flying above the water. Foiling reduces drag by eliminating nearly all friction on the water and allows for top speeds. At the Paris 2024 Olympics, the foiling classes consist of the Men's and Women's Formula Kite (Kiteboards), the Men's and Women's iQFOiL (Windsurfers), and the Nacra 17 (Mixed Multihull)




