Measuring Up

Thanks to your support, the number of trained boat measurers has nearly doubled this year. New measurer, Spencer Kunath, says thank you!

Spencer Kunath exudes excitement when he talks about his new role as a boat measurer.

"This touches people in all kinds of sailing," he says. "And it's going to do nothing but grow in its importance. As computer modeling develops, it's going to be quicker and easier to get a boat measured. And sailors will figure out ways to make the boats go faster."

A TP52 racer, Spencer has been on the 'customer side' of boat measurement four times in the past: three in ORR and one in ORC. Now, after taking the Measurers Training Seminar in San Diego in February, he is on the other side of the process. And it's going great.

"I think the biggest surprise was the diversity of people that went to the training in San Diego," Spencer said. There were 35-year-olds, there were 75-year-olds. The wealth of knowledge in the room was incredible. The trickle down from people who have been doing this for so many years was huge."

Expanding the number of boat measurers around the country is a current goal of US Sailing. And the training that Spencer took was a big step in that direction.

"We're noticing that a lot of measurers are starting to retire," says Sydney Hough, Junior Ratings Officer in US Sailing's Offshore Office. "For this training, we intentionally picked a mix of younger people who can carry on the legacy of measuring along with those who have been doing it for many years and want to keep up to date with current measurement practices so they can continue for another 5 or 10."


"Our other focus was geographical location. We want to train measurers all over the country, so an owner doesn't have to wait a month for somebody to fly from the East Coast to the West Coast. They can call somebody who's two hours away to come measure their boat."

Spencer admits that doing the first measurement on your own is a little challenging. "But it's a fun challenge," he says. "Sometimes you try to measure a boat and there are some physics that are not always predictable. It's great to be able to call Chris or Sydney or Jim at US Sailing and ask how to make it work."



Spencer has measured four boats so far.

The biggest reward, he says, is the time he spends with sailors during the measurement process. Their conversation covers so many topics, like sails, crewing, and how the measurement process works. That does two things: it helps boat owners understand how transparent the VPP ratings rules are, and it helps them understand their boat better.



"I'd like to say thank you to the donors who support the Offshore Office because it benefits people I interact with in so many different ways. As a venture capitalist in the world of sailing, I don't see any better ROIs. The return on that investment is tremendous."
