Club Race Officer Certification Requirements



A Club Race Officer is expected to be able to properly run any race normally conducted at his or her local sailing organization, including organizing the race committee, writing sailing instructions, and scoring the event.

A US Sailing Race Official must:

- be a member of US Sailing and at least 18 years old
- be a person of good character and integrity
- be an experienced racing sailor (no time limit)
- possess a physical or digital edition of the current Racing Rules of Sailing, Including US Sailing Prescriptions

To qualify as a **Club Race Officer**, you must:

- attend and pass the Basic Race Management Seminar at 80% or higher or the Advanced Race Management Seminar at 75% or higher
- maintain current SafeSport training and background screening
- provide with your application the name of an officer or race committee leader at your local sailing organization who has observed your work on the water
- be endorsed by your Area Race Officer

An up-to-date SOARS record is required, showing that you:

- have experience in each race committee job, including setting marks and scoring
- have experience writing or reviewing sailing instructions for the events (reading and discussing the SIs with the race committee chair constitutes reviewing)
- have been the person in charge on the water for at least four separate events*

Additional Recommended Qualifications (not required):

- maintain current first aid and CPR training
- take a US Powerboating class or equivalent
- attend a US Sailing Club Judge Seminar, roundtable or Protest Day
- possess physical or digital editions of Join the Race Committee Team and the Race Management Handbook

Experience: All the experience except racing must take place during the four-year period ending when US Sailing receives your complete application. The majority of the qualifying events at which you have been in charge on the water must take place in the United States.

*Separate events are run under separate sailing instructions, not multiple instances of the same event under the same SIs. Instances of the same event in different years are acceptable.

The Club Race Officer program is administered in each US Sailing Area by the <u>Area Race Officer (ARO)</u>. AROs certify applicants as Club Race Officers when they have met the certification requirements.

Initial certification and renewal: Candidates for initial and renewal certification must submit an <u>application</u>. Race officials are certified for a four-year term ending December 31 of the fourth year.

SafeSport training and background screening: You must maintain <u>SafeSport training</u> (annually) and <u>background screening</u> (every two years). US Sailing covers the cost.

SOARS: You must record your race management activities in <u>SOARS</u>.

Membership: You must maintain your <u>US Sailing membership</u> to keep your race official certification current.

Rulebooks: You can order a paper or waterproof copy of *The Racing Rules of* Sailing from US Sailing or download the mobile app at the Apple Store or Google Play store.
